
Where Would Dr. King Be Today?

Fifty years after Dr. King gave his "Beyond Vietnam" speech, we ask "Where would Dr. King be today?" We believe Dr. King's spirit is with us at the Livermore Lab where new nuclear weapons continue to be designed, saying once again, "In a day when . . . guided ballistic missiles are carving highways of death through the stratosphere, no nation can win a war. Today it is no longer a choice between violence and nonviolence; it is either nonviolence or nonexistence." We look at the wars, the oppression and the ongoing efforts to protect our planet; we still have before us the work to end what Dr. King described as "the giant triplets of racism, materialism, and militarism."

Gather at Vasco and Patterson Pass Roads in Livermore at 6:45 a.m.


Opening music 6:45 a.m.
