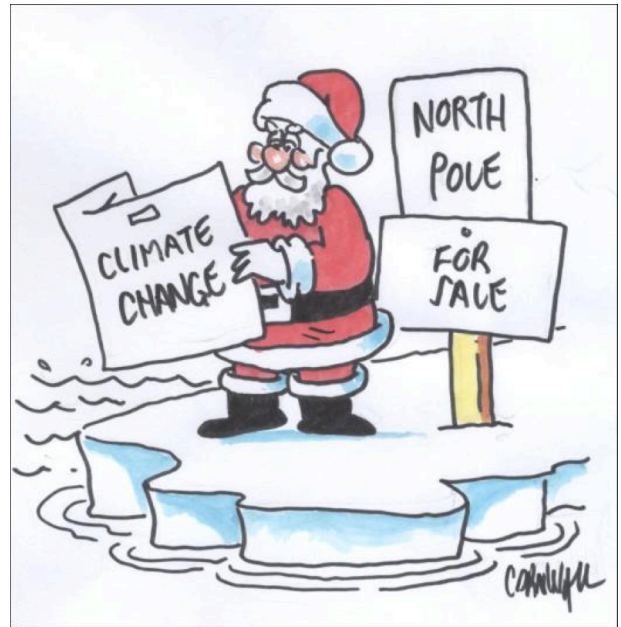

Katharine Hayhoe – Director of Climate Science Center at Texas Tech University and Evangelical Christian. Katharine has been named as one of *Time* magazine's 100 most Influential People for 2014. She is on Showtime's climate documentary *Years of Living Dangerously*, and has authored a book with her pastor husband called *A Climate for Change: Global Warming Facts for Faith-Based Decisions*.

Ron Amundson – Former Chair of Environmental Science, Policy and Management Department, University of California, Berkeley. Ron, Professor of Pedology, has done research on the changing climate's impact on soil and farming.
